On January 16, Mr. Arayik Harutyunyan, Minister of Education and Science of the Republic of Armenia visited Merdinian School accompanied by John Shirajian, President of Armenian Engineers and Scientists of America (AESA), Jirayr Abrahamyan, President of the Alumni Association of the Polytechnic Institute of Armenia, and Dr. Vardan Gevorkyan. After Principal Lina Arslanian's welcoming words and Armenian language teacher Aline Bezdikian-Shirajian's introduction about the background of the School, Rev. 
